To the Board of Governors of McMaster University:

We, the undersigned, are lending our support to the inspiring students and faculty that are calling on the administration of McMaster University to take swift and meaningful action to divest from fossil fuels, in accordance with its institutional commitments and in line with climate science. The administration needs to recognize that students should not feel that resorting to a hunger strike is their only option for protecting our collective future.

McMaster professes to be taking the climate crisis and its responsibility to act seriously. You set a net zero by 2050 goal and centralized this in a new <u>Sustainability Strategy</u>. In 2021, the president of the University wrote to the Board of Governors with an <u>explicit directive</u> to develop a strategy for divestment from fossil fuels, and this directive is reflected in the university's <u>Strategic Plan</u>. Two full years later, the Board has not implemented this directive. As of last year, McMaster held \$30.4 million in assets in the top 200 largest publicly-listed coal, oil, and gas reserves owners in the world, known as the <u>Carbon Underground 200</u>. You have not set a formal, publicly disclosed plan for terminating these investments. It is time to act to divest from fossil fuels.

Further, the university is taking a step backwards on making its campus carbon neutral by building four natural gas-powered generators on environmentally sensitive lands. It is nonsensical to build new fossil fuel powered generation at a time when renewables are less expensive and this project would lock in emissions for years to come.

Taking meaningful steps to address climate change is central to advancing reconciliation and upholding Indigenous rights and self-determination. It is well-established that climate change <u>disproportionately impacts</u> Indigenous and other marginalized populations around the world, and fossil fuel projects in Canada continue to result in egregious <u>violations of Indigenous rights and encroachments onto Indigenous lands</u>.

More than <u>1550 institutions around the world</u>, including a dozen Canadian universities, and some of the world's largest pension funds, have already divested from fossil fuels, thereby sending a bold message to the fossil fuel industry and demonstrating real dedication to creating a brighter world. They have done so in line with their fiduciary responsibilities, properly assessing the financial risk of staying invested in fossil fuels.

We urge McMaster to step up. It's time to put aside the excuses and join with your students and community who are advocating for divestment and a stop to the build out of new gas powered generation.
